

Cabin Air SOF Event Checklist

- If no passengers are onboard, step off the airplane for fresh air.
1. **NOTIFY** pilots with
 - a. Where is the odor? (air vents, fwd, mid, aft, galley, row, oven, lav)
 - b. What does the odor smell like? (musty, dirty, chemical, burning, rotten)
 - c. When it became noticeable. (gate, taxi, climb, cruise, descent, arrival)
 - d. Why are you concerned? (symptoms, passenger complaint, visual concern)

2. **CONTACT**

- b. APFA Safety and Security notification system at **817-357-8786**
- c. FILE an IOD **844-777-8463** if you seek medical attention.

3. **SEEK** medical treatment if you have symptoms.

MedAire via EFB "MedAireWifi" application.

Orange "CALL" button on bottom left corner of the app.

Or call 877-346-9174 /1-480-333-3801.

MedAire will direct FAs for medical attention at nearby facilities. Ask MedAire representative if the facilities provide Arterial Blood Gas with Co Oximetry. Transportation will be via ambulance or Uber Voucher to the medical facility. After medical attention/treatment, IOC will provide additional Uber Vouchers for transportation from the medical facility. Deadheads are arranged by the IOC.

4. **INFORM** the hospital at check-in, "I have been exposed/inhaled toxic fumes." Ask for the Arterial Blood Gas with Co-Oximetry. When asked for insurance information, "This is a workers compensation case. I do not yet have a claim number, but I have their information." **Click here for Medical Information Sheet.**
