

Cabin Odor/Fume Event Checklist



When safe to do so, notify the flight deck with details about the exposure and whether anyone on your crew needs medical attention. If the flight deck is unavailable, contact **Inflight Operations Support (IOS)**.

At the hospital: A Carbon Monoxide blood test is strongly recommended within 4-6 hours of exposure. If your doctor needs more information, share this link: [Medical Information Document](#)

If you received medical treatment, consider calling +1 (844) 777-8463 to file an IOD: A Registered Nurse will answer the call and assist you. [Follow this link to the Injury On Duty Checklist](#) for guidance.



Report promptly: Submit a CERS within 24 hours. Inflight Admin is responsible for recording your protected absence. You are also encouraged to file a Cabin ASAP report to share your safety concerns with the FAA.
